



PROJECT OVERVIEW







Development Project Objectives

- Obtain Government approval for the right to develop Middle Island (still on going)
- Satisfy CTSB (Cultural, Tourism and Sports Bureau) policy:
 - Increase public access to Club facilities
 - Provide training for Elite Sailing Athletes
 - Increase Hong Kong's reputation regionally and internationally in the sport of sailing
- Satisfy ABC needs:
 - Increased boat storage and training facilities
 - Enhance facilities for members
 - Additional pontoon berthing
 - Improved facilities for children
 - Possible future connectivity between ABC and RHKYC












Development Site

BACKGROUND















Key Events 2010 - 2023

- 2010 Review development options and selection of Middle Island
- 2011 Introduction of Building Development Levy
- 2012 Conceptual design options
- 2013 Preparation of Preliminary Design
- 2014 Issue of Preliminary Environmental Review
- 2015 Presentation of Scheme to HAB
 - HAB informal approval in principle
- 2016 Issue of revised Preliminary Environmental Review
- 2017 Preparation of Section 12A submission to Town Planning Board
 - Connection of upgraded power supply
- 2018 Marine Ground Investigation works commence following Government delay of 15 months
- 2018 EPD advises new requirement for Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA)
- 2020 Alternative land formation to protect the amphioxus and coral species.
- 2022- Completion of EIA submission.
- 2023 Termination of (EIA) requirements



KEY SUBMISSIONS HAB & EPD Submission

- Justification for the proposal and area required for the development.
- Based upon analysis of existing usage and forecasts for future demand
- Future benefits for members and non members
- Overall benefit to the local community
- Support of Government policy to promote sport
- Intent to connect with RHKYC for staging of international events and utilities connections
- Community engagement particularly the fishermen association.
- Full Environmental Impact Assessment










Design of New Land Formation


















Summary of Delays

Delay of 4 years

Due to change of environmental requirement

Delay of 2 years
Discovery of rare species of amphioxus and coral resulting in a full re-design of the land formation.

Delay 2 Year Finalizing EPD EIA submission.
























Programme Forecast Obtaining the Right to Develop

Satisfaction of EA requirements

- June 2023

ABC Scope and Cost review

- Jan 2024

- Right to develop will allow amendments to the design
- Final design to support original objectives subject to affordability and optimizing usage of available funds
- Increased storage, realignment of the ramp and provision of improved training facilities are the priorities
- Opportunity to retain the improved clubhouse
- Opportunity to introduce staged development

Section12A application to TPB

- Sept 2024

TPB endorsement of Section 12 A

- Jan 2025

- Submission of draft OZP for CE approval Mar 2025
- Approval Foreshore & Seabed Gazettal Dec 2025

Capital Cost Estimate

Phase IIIA - Boatyard Extension and Ramp - HKD 95M

Phase IIIB - Clubhouse Area - To be prepared

Phase IV - Sailing & Training Center and other facilities

To be redesigned due to the new land formation

Phase V - Pontoon Berthing - To be prepared

Final Scope and Estimate to be reassessed during the ABC Scope and Cost Review













Income and Expenditure Projection

- Expected Funds raised in December 2025 HKD 99 M
- Expected Total expenditure HKD 19.5 M comprising:
- Costs for Middle Island improvement(excluded from HKD 99 M amount above)
 - Utilities upgrade costs HKD 6.6M
 - Following Typhoon Mangkhut damage HKD 4.4M
- Balance in Development Fund in December 2025 HKD 79.5 M











Funding

- Funding is sourced from the Building Levy and a proportion from interest generated through time deposit.
- Entrance fee proportion has varied, 80% on time deposit interest with our bank
- Forecast of funds at December 2025 is HKD 99M which will be insufficient to complete Phase III once all section 12A surveys and submission are completed as well as all consultancy fees paid, a Shortfall of 20% is expected.
- Current sourcing of funds is assumed to continue until completion, maybe additional fund may be raised if the Club decide to take again a portion of entrance fees as previously.
