The tragic events in Japan this past month make us realise just how fragile our existence can be and how Mother Nature can conspire to turn ordinary, comfortable lives into a living nightmare. These days of continuous 24-hour live streaming of TV news and the Internet ensure that, if you wish to tune in, you can follow breaking news with ease and become very involved with the events.

All the news coming out of Japan seemed to be bad but thankfully there have been occasional nuggets of relief like the 60 year old man who clung to the roof of his house and got swept out to more than 10 miles from the coast. Tragically his wife could not hold on as they clambered to the roof but with just a bottle of water and nothing else, he was blessed with a calm sea and after 48 hours was picked up by a naval vessel. Then an 80 year old grandmother and her grandson of 16 were found in the rubble of their house 10 days after the tsunami, having managed to survive on what was left in their fridge. The staggering pictures of massive vessels stranded and beached a considerable distance from the shoreline put the power and enormity of the surges in perspective. In some places the sea swept up to 5 miles inland.

But as good as the news networks are, there will be countless stories of tragedy and relief that have not been told along the vast shoreline of northeastern Japan that was affected by the killer waves. Along the coast there will have been many people who make their living out of the sea and others who just like messing about in boats. There will be people who simply enjoy the beauty of living near the sea in the coastal towns and picturesque villages. As fellow boaters and sea lovers our best wishes go to all those who have suffered from this tragedy.

Members may be interested to know that we have two reciprocal clubs in Japan, both of which are in Kobe so not immediately affected by the disaster. They are the Shioya Country Club and the Kobe Club. We wish them well.

Back in the relative calm of Hong Kong we look forward to the third festival of the year and the onset of warmer weather. No, not the Sevens but Easter which occurs a little later this year. It does seem as if the winter weather has been cooler and more prolonged than recent years and it will be good to get the summer gear out of the wardrobe. We will wait with anticipation to see who the mystery Easter Bunny will be for the egg and spoon race. Maybe we could take a leaf out of Top Gear and keep it a secret for a year or so.

The staff party was held in February at the Royal Hong Kong Yacht Club. A good afternoon and evening was had by all at the staff party held at the Royal Hong Kong Yacht Club. I would like to take this opportunity to thank all of our staff for their hard work and service over the past 12 months. In this spirit of corporate social responsibility (CSR), my team and I are now looking at how to reduce our carbon impact, develop and implement a recycling concept within the Club operation, and adapt our menus in ways that ensure only a sustainable supply of seafood and meat is used. This is a long and difficult process, but I believe meaningful and necessary actions are indispensable in this wasteful society we are living in. I would welcome any help and suggestions in this endeavour and hope to receive your ideas on how to become a greener Club.

The swimming pool is now open and the water temperature varies from 24 to 28 degrees Celsius – not quite yet the proper temperature to cook an egg but good enough for a long relaxing dip on Sunday. Please also note that we have started our swimming lessons again, details for which can be found on our website under "Activities".



New menu

Our new Galley menu is now ready to be launched. It includes your favourite items but I am sure we must have forgotten a few. Drop me a note and I'll make sure this is rectified in the summer menu. Unfortunately, in light of the constant inflation of the cost of food products over the last few months, the price of some menu items had to be increased. However, this is the harsh reality of today's crazy economy. If you are a regular at Park'nShop, you must have noticed that your monthly household spending has increased as well. In any case, I will do my utmost to keep our prices as reasonable as possible for a Club operation, all the while doing my very best to source new products and suppliers as needed to maintain our quality and quantity.

DEVELOPMENT

Membership increase

Despite a substantial growth in numbers at the beginning of this financial year, with a steady membership of over 1000, we still need an increase of 200 members paying subscriptions to ensure a healthy income, in order to sustain our building repairs and maintenance and retain our staff. Without increasing the subscription level, the only way is to increase numbers. I am hereby calling on our members to be our membership agents and help us recruit members while the entry fees are still at the same level. Within a few months, the General Committee will consider increasing our entrance fees; therefore, this is a very good opportunity to invite your friends. In return you will receive free monthly subscriptions as given below:

One new member entitles you to two months free subscription. Two to three new members gets you three months free subscription. Four new members within a month will give you four months free subscription.

Middle Island lease and project development

We are in the process of renewing our Middle Island lease, as we do every five years. In this process we are required by the Government to appoint an authorised person to deal with the legal documentation, and a building engineer to confirm that the building for which the application is being processed is sound and safe. Prior to this process, we had a survey done resulting in the harsh necessity of reinforcing our roof and upgrading our wiring. This has now been completed and the appointment of these

Club representatives has been done. Now we hope that everything should be in correct order to obtain another five-year lease on Middle Island.

Further, on Middle Island, you may all be aware that although we have been allowed to operate on the Island, we only have a temporary occupancy permit. This permit has a lot of restrictions on what we can do and any further improvement will require that the Club take further action toward obtaining a Full Occupation Permit.

This starts with the requirement that an adequate supply of water and electricity be added to the Island and that we no longer depend on being connected to the Royal Hong Kong Yacht Club's supply. Over the years and certainly more recently, there is a need to provide better utility service and space due to the increasing dinghy activities and an overwhelming demand for better food choice and quality on Middle Island. Hence, it is vital that we upgrade our power and water connections. Once the Full Occupancy Permit is obtained, we will be in position to apply for a full club license and be allowed to develop our activities and land suitably to improve our services on Middle Island.

Therefore, looking at these reasons, the Committee has taken the decision to upgrade our electricity and water supply and apply for a Full Occupancy Permit on Middle Island.

While this is good news, the bad news is that improving our electricity setup has been priced at \$4 million, which will of course bring a major pressure on our operations. Nevertheless, this is now progressing and we have just enough reserves to achieve this heavy but necessary first-step improvement.

Looking toward a sustainable long-term plan for Middle Island, the newly created Development Committee is exploring further improvements of our facility and a full project proposal will be available soon for consultation.

Corporate and Horizons design

The House Committee has decided that a fresh look for our corporate image and the way information is delivered needs attention. The Club has employed a design company to redesign our brochures, posters, emails and other documentation the Club produces. You will soon see the result of this work. On the same idea, Horizons, our club magazine which I am sure every member is craving to read every month (specially my column), will also be outsourced to a professional editing company. They will look at the quality of paper and articles and improve the advertisements to achieve a self-financing magazine. The first edition of this new magazine will be in June, and I am hereby calling for articles (even controversial ones) from members to improve the reading interest of Horizons.

Swimming Lessons at ABC

Monday afternoon swimming lessons have just started at ABC and will run through until 27 June. Sessions are available for adults, parent and baby, and children aged 3 years and older. From complete beginners, through gaining confidence in the water to improving techniques and stamina, our Coach Nicola Barguss has options for everyone.

Nicola has been teaching swimming for over 25 years after qualifying in the UK. Her work has encompassed private clubs, school programmes, adults, children and infant swim lessons. After moving to HK, she continued to teach swimming, and over the years has worked for many international schools and ESF Educational Services. Her particular passion within swimming is the Learn To Swim programme which she brings to our club this year.

The ABC swimming lessons will run on Monday afternoons, lessons last 30 minutes (45 minutes for improvers) and cost HK\$160 per lesson for ABC members, and HK\$180 for non-members. 2011 DINGHY SPRING SERIES - RACEDAY 1



A fine warm breezy day attracted 17 competitors to the racing, heralding a strong year of dinghy racing at the club.

Course 4 (modified) was set in Repulse Bay, rather than the usual position between Round Island and Middle Island, so sailors be warned – check out where the start will be laid to allow sufficient time to arrive! Course 4 was a windward-leeward course with Open Division doing two laps. The A-Mark was close to the swimming area barrier.

The first race got off well, in a healthy 15 knot northerly breeze, with some of the bigger boats racing through some OPs who were waiting too close to the start line – fortunately no collisions! In the northerly there were the usual wind lines and lulls with some favouring the right side up towards the Koo Yum temple. The RS500 and 29er, with trapezes deployed, established an early lead, and were first around A in both races, and they and Eberhard in the Laser 2000 made good ground gybing downhill with gennakers up.

The OPs were well sailed generally up the middle of the course in both races, and in the first had a very tight spread between first and last elapsed time.

The wind held on through into the second race and some sailors had problems with the dead downwind sailing, with capsizes seen by even some of the more experienced sailors in the second race!

Peter and Louis in the RS500 and Sophie in the OP took the Race 1 line honours, while Justin in the 29er and Yann in his OP took the gun in the second race.

In the last two months our Dinghy Team have been busy training and attending regattas. We attended two selection events for the Hong Kong Optimist team to compete in the Optimist Worlds in New Zealand in 2012. Both of these regattas were sailed in Tai Tam Bay out of the Hong Kong Sea School.

22 & 23 January Selection Trials

We had 5 ABC sailors competing in the Optimist class and 1 in the Laser 4.7 class. On Day 1 we were greeted with 10 - 12 knots of very cold wind from the North East, our sailors achieving mixed results in the three races sailed. At the start of Day 2 there wasn't much wind and racing was delayed by 4 hours until eventually managing to get one race completed. There was significant current in the very light conditions; the upwind leg took around 20 minutes while sailors managed the downwind course in around 4 minutes. These conditions were very difficult for our ABC sailors but a great learning experience.

ABC Optimist sailors had some of the best races of their careers so far, competing at the top of the fleet of 15 boats. Matthew Wright managed a 2nd in race four, Yann D'Argenlieu a 3rd in race six and James Hodgson a 3rd in race one. New ABC sailors Michael Heidinger and Faith Leung, who have recently joined our Dinghy Team, deserve a special mention for their outstanding Pico sailing, competing against older and much more experienced sailors and showing great boat speed and real potential. Although overall results were disappointing, the significant improvement in our sailors bodes very well for the future!
