1. Rules

- 1.1 The series will be governed by the 'rules' as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing 2013-2016.
- 1.2 The following will apply:
 - The 2013 IRC Rules parts A, B and C.
 - The HKPN Handicap System, as administered by HKSF.
 - Class Rules where they apply.
 - The Notice of Race (NOR).
 - The Aberdeen Boat Club Standard Sailing Instructions 2013.
- 1.3 In case of conflict between any of the above, succeeding items take precedence. This changes RRS 63.7.

2. Advertising

2.1 Boats may be required to display advertising chosen and supplied by the organizing authority.

3 Eligibility and Entry

- 3.1 Eligible boats are cruisers, J80s and multihulls with accommodation, that have a valid HKPN handicap or valid IRC Certificate.
- 3.2 Entries on the day of racing may be accepted at the discretion of the Race Officer. Boats wishing to enter on race day should inform the Committee Boat at their earliest opportunity on VHF Channel 72.









3.3 Divisions, Classes and Handicaps

Racing will be in the classes and under the rating systems as follows.

CLASS Division A SPLIT / SYSTEM
IRC Valid Certificate
HKPN of 980 and below
J80's

Division B

HKPN of 1051 and above

- 3.4 A boat may enter only one class.
- 3.5 Boats with HKPN of 981-1050 may elect to race in Division A or Division B. This must be declared via the online entry form or by hailing the Committee boat before their first race of the series.
- 3.6 Whilst Racing, Division B boats shall display ICF 'B' from their backstay.
- 3.7 IRC rated boats will be only be scored under IRC by entering Division A.
- 3.8 J80s will race in Division A and will also be scored on OD.
- The approximate course lengths for Division A are between 17NM and 26.4NM. The approximate course lengths for Division B are between 12NM and 19.4NM.
- 3.10 IRC Rule 22.4.2 shall not apply. There will be no limitation on crew numbers or weight except as required for boats rated as one design, which shall comply with their class rule.
- 3.11 For a Class to be recognised by the Series, a minimum of 3 boats must enter that Class.

4. Entry Fees

The entry fee is \$800 for the series.

- All geometric courses will be held in the vicinity south east of Lamma Island.

6. Results and Prizes

- 6.1 Provisional results for the days racing will be announced during the post race festivities, as soon as possible after the last boat has crossed the finish line.
- Day Race Prizes: These will be awarded to each first place boat in each Division during the ABC Annual Prize Giving in May 2014.
- 6.3 Overall Series and Mini Series Prizes: These will be awarded for first, second and third place boats in each racing division at the ABC Annual Prize Giving in May 2014.

7. Disclaimer of Liability

The Aberdeen Boat Club, the Organising Committee, the Race Committee, Race Sponsors and their respective representatives, officers, members and volunteers accept no liability whatsoever for any loss of life or property, personal injury and damage caused by, or arising out of the Regatta. The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue racing is hers alone. (RRS Fundamental Rule 4). Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk.

8. Insurance

Entered boats shall have third party liability insurance at least to the minimum cover required under Hong Kong SAR law.

9. Moorings

Subject to availability, temporary moorings can be provided in either Deepwater Bay or Aberdeen Typhoon Shelter for boats wishing to stay overnight (before or after the race). Details may be obtained from the Club on 25533231 (Ext. 834) or by emailing to keelboatsailing@abclubhk.com

10. Car Parking

Car parking at ABC is not available for visitors on race day. However, there is public car parking available close by to the club. Details may be obtained from the Club on 25533231 (Ext. 834) or by emailing to keelboatsailing@abclubhk.com

11. Club House

Visiting competitors from the Royal Hong Kong Yacht Club and Hebe Haven Yacht Club and Discovery Bay Yacht Club may sign chits on the race day on presentation of their club membership card. Other visiting competitors may purchase cash coupons from the Club office or main bar.

12. Food and Beverages

- There will be a buffet breakfast for every race, served in the Galley from 0800 hours at HK\$ 52.
- Drinks and ice are available from the Galley on the day. Take away food is also available but requires pre-order the day before. Fuel is obtainable from the Aberdeen Marina Club fuel pier located opposite the ABC.
- The Galley serves a full range of food and beverage and is open from 0800 to 2200 hours. Lunch is served in the Four Peaks Restaurant from 1230 to 1500 hours and dinner is served from 1830 hours. Last orders are 2200 hours. Shorts and collarless shirts are not permitted in the restaurant in the evening and casual clothing should be clean and smart.
